## HOME SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

### PARENT INFORMATION

1. All students will need to check in and out through the front office.
2. Grace Christian Academy has a dress code policy. Dress code for the Enrichment Program is the same as that for Grace Christian Academy's full-time students. That is:

Girls: Black, navy or khaki slacks, capris, skirts, jumpers, shorts or skorts. Pants may be flat-front or pleated. These pants are often labeled as "uniform", "chinos", and/or "twill". External pockets down the front or sides are not permitted (i.e. cargo & carpenter pants). Sweatpants, sport pants, jersey, and denim are not allowed. Corduroy is acceptable if it meets the above requirements. Skirts, skorts, jumpers and shorts should extend downward to at least 4 inches above the knee (when kneeling). We recommend purchasing at least 2 inches above the knee to allow room for growth.

Boys: Black, navy blue or khaki slacks or shorts. Pants may be flat-front or pleated. These pants are often labeled as "uniform", "chinos", and/or "twill". External pockets down the front or sides are not permitted (i.e. cargo & carpenter pants). Sweatpants, sport pants, jersey and denim are not allowed. Corduroy is acceptable if it meets the above requirements. Shorts should extend downward to at least 4 inches above the knee (when kneeling). We recommend purchasing at 2 inches above the knee to allow room for growth.

Uniform quality pants can be purchased in the uniform section of JCPenney, Macy's, Sears, Kohl's, Target, Wal-Mart, and Old Navy at the beginning of the school year. Several carry stock all year and all have selections available online during the school year.

Tops for girls and boys must be a solid color collared polo/golf shirt (long or short sleeved) without logos, stripes, other patterns, or trim. For cold weather, long sleeve shirts may be worn under short sleeve polos only if they are the same color and shade or white. Otherwise, visible layering is not permitted.

Leggings and tights will only be permitted if they are white or the same color as the skirt/jumper with which they are being worn. Leggings should be free of stripes, patterns, or trim. The same is required of knee socks.

Sweaters, sweatshirts and hooded jackets may be worn over a collared polo during school only if they are solid-colored without logos.

For safety reasons, flip-flops, slides and high heel shoes are not permitted.

Accessories such as hats, scarves, legwarmers, bracelets and necklaces are not allowed. Earrings may be worn if they are smaller than a dime. Belts that fit into belt loops are

allowed; belts used as accessories over clothing are not. (Accessories which are worn will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day at the student's request.)

Students may not wear make-up of any kind.

For P.E., tennis shoes with non-marking soles are **REQUIRED**. Shoes with black soles may not be worn on the gym floor. For safety reasons, running in socks or bare feet will not be permitted.

3. Enrolling in the Homeschool Enrichment Program also qualifies your child to participate in the following:
  - field trips
  - drama and music performances
  - holiday parties
  - Field Day in May
  - Scholastic book orders
  - GCA yearbook (purchase in the spring)
  - ASCI's TerraNova standardized testing (for a fee of \$50/student)

Home educating parents are welcome/encouraged to volunteer as chaperones for events.

4. Lunch/recess precede enrichment blocks to provide additional time for enrichment students to fellowship with the full-time students. Your child(ren) are welcome to bring a lunch from home, however, please be aware that if bringing peanut products, students will need to sit at the designated "peanut" table.
